Production	Shō and the Demons of the Deep
Company	Independent Arts Projects (IAP) in association with National Theatre of Scotland
Location	Rehearsals & tech at Rockvilla, open at Platform, Easterhouse then tour to small theatres, arts centres & community spaces across Scotland.
Fee	A weekly fee of £700 including holiday pay, for thirteen (13) weeks. Transport is provided, as are per diems, all accommodation & travel on tour.
Dates of contract	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Rehearsals & Tech week: Monday 11th March – Sunday 14th April - Touring: Monday 15th April – Sunday 9th June - Some training may be required in advance of rehearsals. This will be agreed and paid at an appropriate rate.
Schedule & hours	We aim to work a maximum of 5 days out of 7 with two days off together where possible. Travel days are working days. Where we go over an 8hr day we will give time back within the schedule. Weekly hours will not exceed those set out by ITC-Equity small-scale theatre agreement.
Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The SM is the key point of contact for the company in rehearsals and on the road. They support the rehearsal and production process and support all get-ins, fit-ups, loading/unloading & get-outs on tour. • Working with the Technical Stage Manager (TSM), Production Manager and Designers they realise the show to a high standard on tour. • Supporting the installation & maintenance of props, set & costume. • The SM creates and maintains the prompt copy/book & cues the show. • Supported by the Production Manager & working with the TSM they are responsible for ensuring a safe working environment. • Drives (a Long-Wheel Based transit).
Notes	As part of our recruitment process, we will ask for proof of your right to work in the UK (this is usually your passport, visa or similar).

We welcome applications from people who are:

- Someone who is experienced working as a Stage Manager.
- Someone who has experience of small-to-mid-scale touring in Scotland.
- Someone who works well as part of a small team.
- Someone who has worked with young people as audiences.
- Based in Scotland, they are a licensed driver aged 25+.
